New Club Member







***** HELPFUL HINTS *****

In hardware stores, you can buy a tool for about 1 or 2 dollars that cement finishers use. They are called floate and are usually made of redwood with a large comfortable handle. Measuring 5 x 12 inches, they make ideal sanding blocks for 90 % of your construction. The sandpaper must be cemented to the surface, so a contact cement that becomes soft when heated should be used. I use a rubber-based paper cement that becomes soft when using a propane torch when the sandpaper is worn out. The edges and corners take most abuse, so double gluing at these points would be helpful. Most sandpaper comes in 11 inch lengths and the blocks being 12 inches should be trimmed $\frac{1}{2}$ inch at each end to keep the handle centered. This tool has to be used carefully, but when used properly, it will greatly speed up your sanding chores. If you dig in a corner, you can cause a lot of damage; if a corner of the sandpaper should pull loose, the resulting gorge will require filling and more sanding, so use carefully. These blocks are beautiful for sanding wing ribs to true them prior to sheeting and, after the sheeting is completed, used again for cleaning up the little knobs and bumps. Use a coarse grit paper and use little pressure or the area over the ribs will be sanded too thin. As you use them, you will find many different uses as I have. I have three of them on my bench with different grits and use them constantly.
